
Feedback Survey for 2018 ACE Innovative Teaching & Learning Workshop at Hokkaido University

In 2018 6U-HAPPIER hosted our ACE Innovative Teaching & Learning Workshop directed by Prof. Roderick Smith of Imperial College London at Hokkaido University on 13 and 14 September 2018. 
I have questions related to the innovative teaching from Prof. Rod Smith. Was it the only workshop from Prof. Rod Smith? Are there any other advanced workshops follow?
